WAC SPORTS COMMUNITY INITIATIVES

EDUCATION > NO LIMIT TO READING

This program motivates our primary school youth to actively pursue reading both in class and at home, rewarding their efforts, but most importantly improving their capability and preparing them for senior school years.

CULTURE > LAKE MUNGO CULTURAL IMMERSION

Access to an opportunity like this is very limited and can only happen through a handful of people. You are invited to join Geoff Simpson on country in Lake Mungo for a unique spiritual cultural connection.

EDUCATION > SCHOOL ATTENDANCE PROGRAM

The original George Rose school attendance program started in 2011. The outcome of this initiative saw school attendance rise from 10% to 85% over a year for 80 students (41% boys and 59% girls). Taken over by the NSW Education Department in 2020, the retention rate has decreased. We are reinvigorating this project and aim to bring attendance back to pre 2020 levels.

WAC SPORTS COMMUNITY INITIATIVES

SPORT > WALGETT RUGBY LEAGUE KNOCKOUT

Our marquee community initiative. Held in Walgett NSW, this event runs for a full day in September. Supported by over a dozen local remote communities with as many as 40 teams participating. The event has over 4000 attendees with majority travelling from surrounding communities. Over 97% of attendees are Aboriginal and live in remote parts of NSW.

SPORT > YOUTH SPORTING ASPIRATIONS

Supporting the aspirations of disadvantaged youth through economic support, mentoring, access to training, access to sporting opportunities, or creating a platform for success to our Indigenous youth disadvantaged via remote living, socio economic standing, or lack of resourcing.

SPORT > ANNUAL NSW ABORIGINAL RUGBY LEAGUE KNOCKOUT

The largest gathering of Aboriginal people in the country, this 4 day event has been successfully community controlled and run for over 50 years, a rich history and connection with our people. Supporting us at this event helps us participate in this modern day corroboree, a celebration of sport, community and culture.
